19.091 EPA Brownfield Cleanup Grant Application – Public Meeting

HBPW is preparing an application for an EPA Brownfield Cleanup Grant to assist with the expenses related to the remediation of asbestos in the James De Young (JDY) facility prior to demolition. Budgetary estimates for the demolition of the JDY facility indicate the cost for asbestos remediation in excess of \$2,000,000. The maximum a successful applicant can receive from the EPA through this process is \$500,000, and the applicant must pay at least 20% of the cost of the remediation.

Asbestos and other hazardous materials are required to be removed by a qualified contractor prior to the start of building demolition activities. Asbestos is used in the building as insulation on pipes, as insulation within the boilers, and is present in other materials such as floor and ceiling tiles and electrical equipment. HBPW posted a completed Brownfield Cleanup Grant application to our website (www.hollandbpw.com) on January 17, 2019, and will be accepting written comments to the application by email, or delivery to the HBPW Service Center at 625 Hastings Avenue, until January 24, 2019. In addition, a public comment period will be held as part of a public meeting of the HBPW Board of Directors on January 21, 2019, at the HBPW Service Center Boardroom.

All public comments will elicit a response from HBPW and will be included with the application. The grant application will be submitted to the EPA for approval by January 31, 2019.
