STUDY Sludge Processing Alternatives Study

TOPICS

After completion of the anaerobic digester project, the biosolids from the site will be treated to Class A standards. The transition to a Class A product opens up new opportunities for the ultimate disposition of the biosolids generated at the site. A tactical action undertaken in FY2021 evaluated several options for disposal of the Class A biosolids, the results of which are being presented to the Board. The study detailed HBPW (alone) as well as HBPW + Regional (Ottawa County Entities).
